Peterborough Butterfly Run Creates Free Lending Libraries, Loss Kits and Provides Training to Healthcare Providers

This past year the Peterborough Butterfly Run announced several funded initiatives in partnership with the Partners in Pregnancy Clinic and GPHSF, Your Family Health Team Foundation, to support individuals and families that have experienced a loss during pregnancy, the loss of a child or are unable to conceive.

Lending Libraries were unveiled in October 2018, featuring 11 books to support mothers, fathers, siblings and family members. There are now more than 10 locations across Peterborough City & County and all books are free to borrow. The Peterborough Butterfly Run Committee has also been working diligently over the past year to create **Early and Later Loss Kits**, filled with comfort and commemorative items for those that have suffered a loss during pregnancy. These are available at Partners in Pregnancy Clinic, PRHC, Peterborough Midwives, primary care providers or by emailing ptbutterflyrun@gmail.com.

GPHSF, Your Family Health Team Foundation was also proud to partner on hosting a **Resolve Through Sharing (RTS)** training session, the gold standard in perinatal, neonatal & pediatric bereavement training. Thanks to funds raised at previous runs, Tracy Condon, a Mental Health Clinician at the Partners in Pregnancy Clinic, was able to obtain RTS trainer qualifications and now provides training to healthcare providers here in Peterborough. More than 50 healthcare providers attended the Fall 2018 training session and are now more equipped with knowledge and personal awareness while providing care to grieving families. A second training session is planned for Fall 2019.


The 3rd annual Peterborough Butterfly Run had over 870 participants and 100 volunteers gathered at Millennium Park in April 2018 raising more than \$67,000. Kelly Farley, Author of "Grieving Dads" (featured in the lending libraries), hosted an afternoon workshop exclusively for grieving fathers the day before and also gave an inspiring keynote address at the Run. Community Care's Access to Primary Care Transportation Program Receives \$5,000 Grant

Community Care's grant and extended funding for the Access to Primary Care program ended in September 2018; GPHSF, Your Family Health Team Foundation was happy to respond with a **\$5,000 grant** to help continue this essential service while a source of long-term funding was secured. Community Care provides transportation and accompaniment of Personal Support Workers to individuals who require support to attend appointments with their primary care provider and other local health services. The service is free of charge and primarily for those who require assistance beyond what is offered by a volunteer driver due to mobility or cognitive limitations.



Foundation Funds Ultrasound Enhancement to Impact Patient Access to Care



A probe enhancement for existing ultrasound equipment at The Medical Centre was funded with a **\$16,000 grant** from GPHSF, Your Family Health Team Foundation in Summer 2018. As a result, a third diagnostic imaging exam room is now open, maximizing timely access to the service for patients. The Medical Centre accepts referrals from all

clinicians as well as self-referrals from the Ontario Breast Screening Board – to date they have provided approximately 23,000 patient exams annually and, with this new piece of equipment, they hope to increase access in coming years.

Over \$65,000 Raised at 3rd Annual Tebey Golf Classic

With special thanks to all golfers, VIP attendees, sponsors, and volunteers who supported the 3rd annual Tebey Golf Classic on May 31 at Black Diamond Golf Club, more than **\$65,000** was raised to support youth and mental health in our community. To date, the annual golf tournament has funded the YES Shelter's Youth Homelessness Prevention Program. The program is a partnership initiative

with Peterborough Youth Services and is fully funded by GPHSF, Your Family Health Team Foundation, and ensures youth who might experience homelessness – and often mental health crisis – are supported and reconnected with their families where possible. Since the service launched in September 2018, YES has diverted many from shelter service and ensured that shelter services have not been over capacity.

211 Help Line to Prevent Local Youth Homelessness



The support of GPHSF, Your Family Health Team Foundation and the Tebey Golf Classic allowed YES to pilot the Youth Homelessness Prevention Program over the past year, supporting clients in the community with an immediate response. Through the generosity of Ted and Glenda Hunter, all 211 staff were properly trained and familiar with the program so they could accurately assist clients with navigation. As a result, now anyone in the community can simply dial 211 at any time, 24 hours a day, 365 days of the year for support. If a young person feels that they might experience homelessness or housing insecurity, the 211 Dispatchers will connect youth or families to YES' outreach team for an immediate response to the crisis.

YES staff will then work collaboratively with Peterborough Youth Services' Community Response Team, ensuring youth and their families have the mental health support they need to support the young person in crisis. The marketing campaign launched in March 2019 will help spread awareness of the program and has been supported by the Peterborough Foundation, Durham College and talented graphic designer Stephen Maschke who created the artwork for the campaign.
