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The **Peterborough Butterfly Run** was another resounding success. The event raised over \$34,000 to support families in our community. Funds raised at the event have been used to provide ongoing specialized education in Perinatal Bereavement Care to healthcare providers across Peterborough City and County, in partnership with the Partners In Pregnancy Clinic (PiPC). They have also been used to establish more than 10 lending libraries for individuals and their families located across Peterborough City and County, as well as the development of bereavement kits for families and individuals who experience early and later pregnancy loss and infant loss. Our aim is to return to an in-person run in the spring of 2023. Look for more

PACA TOGETHER CONCUSSION EDUCATION

To coincide with Rowan's Law Day in Ontario, PACA (Peterborough Athletic Concussion Awareness) released its four-part youth sport concussion educational documentary series called Recognize, Remove, Manage and Prevent. Featuring content primarily from Peterborough area athletes, medical staff, doctors, and researchers, the documentary series

purpose is to be an educational and awareness resource for parents, coaches and anyone who is involved in youth sports. On December 21st (Winter Solstice) we held Darkness to Light with **Hospice Peterborough**. It was an outdoor sunrise gathering held at Rogers Cove for anyone impacted by suicide and overdose. An art installation created by Lee Higginson (left) called Frayed/Bound, which involves messages to loved ones who died by suicide and overdose, was unveiled in July. The event raised \$1,455 in donations for Hospice's suicide bereavement programs.



We were happy to be part of securing \$15,000 in funding to support the **YWCA Nourish Project**. One in two woman-led households in our region is struggling to put healthy food on the table. As a result, mothers are compromising the quality and quantity of food they eat, to provide their children with as much food as possible. In a recent survey of Nourish participants, over 86% of respondents noted that they experience depression or other mental health challenges (particularly anxiety and/or PTSD) due to food insecurity. At the same time, 79% stated that their food boxes help them manage those health conditions. One participant told us that her food box "improves her mental health and gives [her an] incentive to cook; it's fresh and it's nourishing." 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A Brief History of GPHSF, Your Family Health Team Foundation and A Spotlight on The Peterborough Family Health Team.

GPHSF, Your Family Health Team Foundation (originally St. Joseph's Care Foundation) has long and deep roots within the Peterborough community. It was originally part of St. Joseph's Health Centre which was founded in 1890, based in East City, and one of the two hospitals in Peterborough for a long period of time. A Foundation for the Hospital was created in 1985 named St. Joseph's General Hospital Foundation. In the 1990's a directive was given by the Province of Ontario's Health Services Restructuring Commission to close the facility as a new centralized regional hospital was being planned. Once this directive was given, a plan was needed to decide what would be done with the remaining funds the hospital Foundation had in trust. Part of the funds were directed to create St. Joseph's Care Foundation, focused on patient care needs in our community. In 2005, the Foundation expanded its vision to support partnerships focused on bridging gaps in community-based health care. Not long after that it developed a partnership with the Peterborough Family Health Team (then known as Primary Health Care Services of Peterborough) in support of community-based healthcare services. The Foundation rebranded as Greater Peterborough Health Service Foundation, later to be named GPHSF, Your Family Health Team Foundation.

Although the Foundation works with many community partners to bridge gaps in care, our focus remains on community-based health care services and our partnership with the Peterborough Family Health Team. **The Peterborough Family Health Team (PFHT)** was one of the first Family Health Teams in Ontario, providing a team-based approach to patient care, and supports family doctors working in the Family Health Organizations (FHO). PFHT also supports interprofessional healthcare providers including Mental Health Clinicians, Nurse Practitioners, Pharmacists, Physician Assistant's, Registered Dietitians, Registered Nurses, and Registered Practical Nurses. This approach is designed to create a more integrated healthcare system that meets the needs of patients. PFHT is itself a Not-For-Profit, funded by Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care, and supported by GPHSF, Your Family Health Team Foundation.

Although GPHSF and PFHT have collaborated on many projects over the years, one of our main supports is providing funding to the **Compassion Fund**. The directive of the Compassion Fund is to support patients in health equity, providing such resources as blood pressure cuffs for home readings, fresh food boxes, assisting with medical supplies not covered by OHIP, providing transportation to medical appointments, among other needs. This funding can be accessed by clinicians to directly support their patients and address barriers to care that the patient may be encountering. This funding can be transformative for a patient's health outcome, providing equipment they may not be able to get otherwise, fresh food, or even just a ride to a very important medical appointment. It allows the clinicians to do more to support their patients.

With this year's annual report we are asking you to donate to the Compassion Fund to help GPHSF and PFHT's joint mission of bridging gaps and breaking down barriers to access to care.
